New Library System OCLC Worldshare Management Services (WMS) and WorldCat Discovery



At the beginning of the spring semester, the library transitioned to a new system to checkout materials, OCLC Worldshare Management Services (WMS). A state-of-the-art system developed for the web, WMS seamlessly merges management and discovery of print and electronic resources.

On **June 1, 2016**, the AUS Library will roll out OCLC's WorldCat Discovery for our users, which will take the place of both our Millennium Classic Catalog and our Summon Discovery interface. Many of you will have already used WorldCat Discovery to renew books and place holds, following our migration to OCLC's WMS system in February. You can preview the new interface at aus.on.worldcat.org/discovery. Summon, our current search interface, will remain in place until May 31, 2016.

WorldCat Discovery searches a shared bibliographic database used by thousands of libraries around the world, and offers researchers more specific searching, as well as access to a larger world of scholarship. Faculty and graduate students have the ability to more easily place document delivery requests to books and other items held at libraries around the world.



A total of 755 books in both English and Arabic have been cataloged and integrated with the existing library collection.
