

AUS Library Audio Tour

The AUS Library now provides an audio tour which you can take using your mobile phone and QR code technology.



What are QR codes?

QR codes are two-dimensional matrices that represent a URL or any other type of textual information.

The QR code example on the right connects directly to the Library's audio tour.

To use QR codes you will need:

An Internet enabled mobile phone with a built in camera, a QR code reader app such as www.i-nigma.mobi (free for download).

To take the AUS Library Audio Tour using your mobile:

- Step 1. Download and open a free QR code reader on your mobile phone such as www.i-nigma.mobi (Many mobiles come pre-installed with a reader)
- Step 2. Point your phone at the Library's Audio Tour QR code and scan using the QR app
- Step 3. Pick up or print out the AUS Library Audio Tour map
- Step 4. Visit each map location point and listen to audio descriptions now listed on your mobile

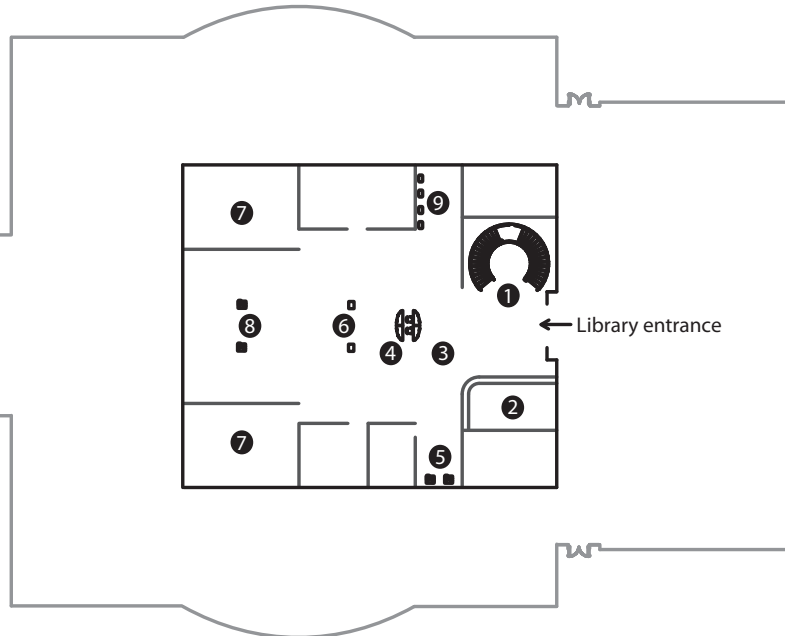

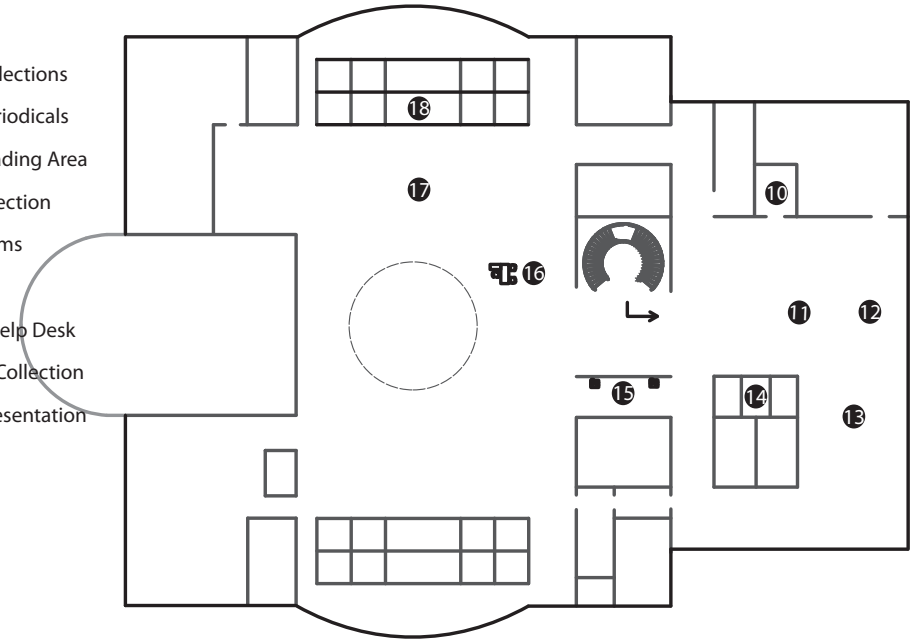
