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MESSAGE from the University Librarian



Greetings! We're celebrating the start of a new year by introducing Encore, a new easy-to-use search and discovery interface that dramatically improves the "findability" of library content.

Just one click and Encore displays results in a faceted format (different sections of the screen) in relevance ranked order. You can quickly refine your search by format (book, DVD, e-journal), library location or subject. Encore also helps you find similar items, produces tag clouds and alerts you to recently added materials. For students, Encore provides one click searching of five general academic databases just to help them get started. The Encore portal provides a good picture of the types of resources that are available in the Library and makes it easy to initiate a keyword search for journal articles across disciplines.

The Library's traditional catalog – now termed "classic" – will remain available for those who prefer it. We hope you will find Encore as useful as we do. Let us know what you think!

Introducing encore



The AUS Library announces the introduction of Encore, a new search engine for discovering all the library's resources, both print and electronic. From one search box, Encore will return the most relevant results and allow you to refine your results with a single click.



You can limit your results by availability, location, type of material (DVD, etc.), language and date.

There are also "tag clouds" of relevant subject terms that allow you to narrow or widen your search. With another click you can retrieve journal articles for the same search.
